JIM CROW LAWS

QUICK FACTS

- After the civil war, slavery was over but African Americans had 2 problems.
 - I) They were uneducated
 - 2) They were unemployed
- Life did not get better for freed slaves just because slavery was outlawed. African Americans were still discriminated against.

RACIAL SEGREGATION

- After the United States Abolished slavery, slaves were freed, the Jim Crow laws were passed.
- The Jim Crow Laws took over the South and continuously discriminated African Americans.
- They made it legal to maintain separate facilities for blacks and whites.
- The South also tried to keep black people from voting.







RISE OF BLACK FACE

- "Jim Crow" was a derogative term used to describe the injustice and inequality African Americans faced. This term was known, after the 18828 Minstrel song "Jump, Jim Crow" was performed by an American actor representing a stereotypical African American person.
- The Jim Crow Laws took over the South and continuously discriminated African Americans.





LYNCHING

- During the 20th century, there was a lot of anti-Black propaganda. Many newspaper articles, novels, and journals portrayed African American negative stereotypes.
- The Southern legislation used tactics and violence to intimidate African Americans.
- Lynching was a common way to intimidate African Americans.
- Lynching was an illegal act, and public killing of an accused person by a large group of people.

LYNCHING

- Lynching was an illegal act, and public killing of an accused person by a large group of people.
- Many of the victims were hanged or shot. Other victims were burned, beaten, and dismembered.

AMENDMENTS DURING RECONSTRUCTION

- After several cruel cases of lynching, the Supreme Court passed the following amendments.
- The 13th Amendment, abolished slavery.
- The 14th Amendment, granted citizenship to all the people who are born in the United States.
- The 15th Amendment, gave African Americans the right to vote!
